1. Ratification Of Lilburn Emergency Order No. 2020-01

A motion to ratify City of Liburn Emergency Order No. 2020-01, an Order that temporarily closes or modifies certain businesses and mandates social distancing within the city limits from noon on March 25, 2020 until April 6, 2020 at noon was made by Council member Voigt, seconded by Council member Batterton.

**Motion passed with a 3-0 vote.**

2. Adoption Of Lilburn Emergency Order No. 2020-02

A motion to approve City of Lilburn Emergency Order No. 2020-02, an Order that expands on the mandates imposed by Order No. 2020-01, directing residents to stay at their place of residence, non-essential businesses to close, and travel to be restricted to the conduct of essential activities only from midnight on March 27, 2020 until midnight on April 6, 2020 was made by Council member Price, seconded Council member Voigt.

Further Discussion:

Mayor Dunn stated that he was on a conference call with Gwinnett county this morning and that there were minor changes/revisions to the order.

City Manager Bill Johnsa asked if we could grant the Mayor the ability to sign additional orders to late be ratified at the next council meeting.

A motion to amend the previous motion to approve the following language "to authorize the Mayor to execute any further required order which will than be ratified by the city council," was made by Council member Price, seconded by Council member Batterton.

**Motion passed with a 3-0 vote.**

There being no further business, Council member Price made a motion to adjourn at 1:12 p.m., seconded Council member Voigt.
