

June 10, 2024 City Council Meeting Recap

Last night, the City Council:

* By a 3-1 vote, approve a motion to deny Resolution No. 2024-01, an application to rezone 4413 and 4423 Killian Hill Road from residential to mixed use.

* By 4-0 votes:

* Tabled Resolution No. 2024-05, a resolution to establish the 2024-2025 fee schedule for administrative fees, fees for services, regulatory fees, license fees, permit fees and rental fees.

* Approved Ordinance No. 2024-624, adoption of the Fiscal Year 2024-2025 budget and the five-year Capital Improvement Plan.

* Approved Resolution No. 2024-02, an amendment of the official zoning map from Commercial Business to R-1 (low density residential).

* Approved Ordinance No. 2024-630, an amendment to add distilleries as a new use.

* Approved Ordinance No. 2023-263, text amendments to the Georgia State Minimum Standard Plumbing Code to address water efficiency standards of the Metro District Water Resources Management Plan.

* Approved Ordinance No. 2024-626, an amendment to repeal city codes related to tennis courts, which have been removed, and to match the current fee schedule for rentals.

* Approved Ordinance No. 2024-627, an amendment of the purchasing threshold for goods and service.

* Approved Ordinance No. 2024-631, an amendment to the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 budget that increases the general fund revenue by \$402,196, reconciles expenditures, adjusts revenues and expenses in various funds.

* Authorized the sale of surplus city assets.

* Approved 2024 Mayor and City Council appointments for additional Municipal Court solicitors.
